Ohio University, Division of Physical Therapy, seeks applications and nominations for a tenure-track faculty position at the level of Assistant or Associate Professor depending upon qualifications. It is an 11 month full time appointment. We seek a candidate with a commitment to working effectively with students, faculty and staff from diverse backgrounds. Rank, salary, and teaching expertise are negotiable as we are seeking the best and most qualified person for the position. Those with expertise in neurological and/or acute care rehabilitation are especially encouraged to apply. It is expected that the candidate will have an established research agenda and a record of peer-reviewed publications if seeking a position at the associate professor or above rank. Collaborative and successful faculty are available to mentor in teaching and research.

Established in 1804, Ohio University is a doctoral/research extensive university and the oldest public institution of higher learning in the state of Ohio. It is located in Athens, in the scenic Appalachian foothills. As a comprehensive institution, Ohio offers distinctive and high quality undergraduate and excellent focused graduate education. The Division of Physical Therapy has a distinguished history beginning in 1984. We began by offering the baccalaureate degree in Physical Therapy in 1984 and the MPT degree in 1996 which was phased out with the inception of the DPT program in 2003. We were the first institution to grant the DPT degree in Ohio. We accept approximately 40 students per year into our three year program. We have excellent facilities, including research space for each of the faculty members.

Description: Ohio University is a doctoral/research intensive state university with 21,000 students on its picturesque Athens campus and another 8,500 students on five regional campuses. The Division of Physical Therapy is within the School of Rehabilitation and Communication Sciences in the College of Health Science and Professions (<http://www.ohio.edu/chsp>).

Job Qualifications

The successful candidate will hold an entry-level physical therapy degree as well as a post-professional doctoral degree (or obtained by 5/18/13) and be eligible for licensure in the state of Ohio and have evidence of successful graduate teaching.

Preference will be given to candidates with teaching expertise in neurological rehabilitation and/or acute care/cardiopulmonary; however, it is not required for application
