The School of Physical Therapy at Pacific University Oregon invites applications for a 9-month, full-time faculty position in our entry-level Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) program. The academic rank of assistant or associate professor and tenure-track options will depend on qualifications and experience of the successful candidate. The position is available beginning in the 2018/2019 academic year. Salary is commensurate with qualifications and experience.

**Special Position Characteristics:** The successful candidate will be expected to teach in one or more content areas including: pediatrics, physical agents, educational strategies, and evidence-based practice (potentially including coordination responsibilities). Additional responsibilities include scholarship activities, student advisement, student capstone project direction in the entry-level DPT program, curriculum development, service at all levels of the University, and service to the profession. Specific assignments are dependent upon program needs. Candidates must be committed to student-centered education as well as working cooperatively with faculty and staff in the School, College, and University.

**Qualifications:** The ideal candidates will have a terminal academic degree (PhD, EdD, DSc) in physical therapy or in a related field. Candidates with a DPT degree and board certification will also be considered. Applicants must have a minimum of 5 years of clinical experience and possess an Oregon Physical Therapist License or be eligible for licensure in Oregon. Prior teaching, research, and service experience is preferred.

**Description:** **General Information:** The School of Physical Therapy at Pacific University offers education for entry into the profession. Pacific University is a comprehensive independent university located 18 miles west of Portland, Oregon. The University is comprised of the Colleges of Health Professions, Optometry, Business, Education, and Arts and Sciences that serve approximately 2,000 graduate and 1,800 undergraduate students. The College of Health Professions consists of the Schools of Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Physician Assistant Studies, Dental Hygiene Studies, Healthcare Administration and Leadership, Graduate Psychology, Pharmacy, and Audiology.
