We seek a dynamic individual who possess excellent communication and problem solving skills; excellent organizational skills; has the ability to work collaboratively with students, faculty and clinicians; and, is proficient in or motivated to learn to use technology in education and clinical settings. We seek a forward thinking individual with initiative to continue to evolve the clinical education program in partnership with our clinical affiliates. Preferred candidates will possess an earned clinical doctorate, have a minimum of 5 years of clinical experience with 3 years of administrative, supervisory and/or clinical education experience, be an APTA credentialed clinical instructor, and be eligible for licensure as a physical therapist in Pennsylvania. Academic rank, workload expectations, and salary are commensurate with qualifications.

The Department of Physical Therapy features 5,000 sq. feet of state of the art classrooms and teaching laboratories as well as research laboratory space. The faculty within the Department of Physical Therapy embraces a culture of clinical excellence through interprofessional education and practice, innovative teaching in the Hamilton Clinical Simulations Center, and integrated experiential learning at Thomas Jefferson University Hospital. The Department of Physical Therapy consists of 14 full-time faculty and a student enrollment of 60 students per professional class. The Department of Physical Therapy is an integral part of the Jefferson School of Health Professions (JSHP) which also includes the departments of Bioscience Technologies, Family and Couple Therapy, General Studies, Occupational Therapy, and Radiologic Sciences.
