THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS MEDICAL BRANCH at Galveston invites applications for an Assistant Professor of Instruction, non-tenure track faculty position /Assistant Professor, tenure track faculty position in the Doctor of Physical Therapy program.

The UTMB physical therapy program is the oldest in the state of Texas with a strong alumni base. UTMB student body is praised as one of the most diverse in the country.

Current faculty members have clinical research agendas focused on acquired brain injury, recovery from bed rest and post-operative interventions, pelvic floor dysfunction, global health initiatives, posture, gait, patient perceptions, and the use of technology to promote physical activity in youth and older adults with mobility disabilities.

The University provides a dynamic academic environment that fosters strong collaborative and interprofessional efforts within university hospitals, the Division of Rehabilitation Sciences, Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences, the Sealy Center on Aging, School of Nursing, School of Medicine, Institute for Translational Science, Shriners's Burn Hospital for Children, and the Institute for Medical Humanities.

In April 2015, we added the Bridge PTA to DPT curriculum and entered our first cohort. The Bridge DPT is a hybrid program with the majority of the content delivered online and labs delivered on weekends 3-4 times a semester.

From the Gulf Coast beaches of Galveston to Houston, the fourth largest city in the nation, the area offers a wealth of educational, cultural, and recreational activities for its residents along with a reasonable cost of living.

The preferred candidate will have an academic doctorate (e.g., PhD) in a physical therapy or physiology related field and the potential to make strong contributions to the program's research efforts.

Description:

The program has need for faculty expertise in exercise physiology and/or cardiovascular & pulmonary. However, applications are welcome from candidates in any specialization. Responsibilities of this new faculty member may include teaching within areas of interest and expertise; university, community and professional service; mentoring of students; and ongoing scholarly activity. It is preferred but not required that the applicant be eligible for PT licensure in Texas.

The position is available immediately at a rank and salary commensurate with qualifications. Applications will be accepted and reviewed until qualified candidates are identified.
