Daemen College invites applications for a full-time, 12-month, tenure track faculty position in the Physical Therapy Program beginning September 2018. A non-tenure track position may also be considered, depending on qualifications and scholarly readiness. Within the Division of Health and Human Services, Daemen College offers both an entry level Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) degree program. The DPT curriculum is a 6 year, 3+3 program. Students may apply to the Bachelor of Science in Natural Science/DPT program as freshmen or transfers. Students already possessing a baccalaureate degree may apply directly to the professional phase of the curriculum. The Department of Physical Therapy is currently comprised of 16 highly motivated core faculty members engaged in a variety of clinical, service, and scholarly activities with a common goal of providing an outstanding educational experience for our students. Programs and activities are available to mentor junior faculty in pedagogy and scholarship. External clinical practice opportunities exist locally across all practice patterns. Daemen College provides a dynamic academic environment that fosters strong collaborative and inter-professional efforts within the College and local medical community. Our Academic and Wellness Center recently opened on campus, which provides state of the art lecture and laboratory facilities that support the delivery of our curriculum and research endeavors.

Daemen College is a small private institution offering Baccalaureate, Masters, and entry-level Doctoral degrees in a wide variety of professional and liberal arts programs. Description: The preferred candidate for this position would have primary teaching responsibilities in the neuromuscular physical therapy clinical practice area. Additionally, there may be an opportunity to teach introductory/pre-professional PT courses, pharmacology, orthotics and prosthetics, spinal cord injury rehabilitation, biostatistics, and other related content, as well as to mentor students in patient care experiences on-campus and in clinical research. Non-teaching responsibilities would include student academic advising, participating in departmental and college-wide committees, clinical practice, and ongoing scholarly activity within a related field. Opportunities for internal funding to establish and strengthen research projects are available on a competitive basis.

In addition, the preferred candidate will have completed, or be nearing completion of, an academic doctorate (PhD, EdD, DHSc, etc) in Physical Therapy or related field and be eligible for PT licensure in New York State. Consideration will be given to applicants possessing a DPT with board certification/specialization (i.e. NCS, GCS, etc), clinical experience in the neuromuscular practice pattern, and previous instructional experience.

Academic rank and salary and will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Excellent fringe benefits are available. Review of applications begins immediately and will continue until the position is filled.
