Western Michigan University (WMU) invites applications and nominations for two (2) full-time, fiscal-year (12 month), tenure-track, assistant/associate professor appointments in the Department of Physical Therapy for the developing Doctor of Physical Therapy Program. Expected start date is flexible, with an earliest start date for one position of January 1, 2018.

The Department of Physical Therapy and the Doctor of Physical Therapy Program were established and approved in 2015 after completion of a comprehensive feasibility study and planning process. A Founding Chair was appointed by the WMU Board of Trustees effective January 1, 2017. The physical therapy program at WMU plans to apply for candidacy through CAPTE in December 2018, and it expects to accept its first student cohort in Summer 2019. We are seeking highly motivated, energetic, and team-oriented individuals who wish to contribute to the development, implementation, and ongoing assessment of an innovative, contemporary, and student-centered curriculum.

- Strong oral, written, and interpersonal skills
- Ability to function well within a collegial, collaborative work environment

- An academic doctoral degree (PhD, ScD, EdD, or DHS) earned from a regionally accredited institution; preference for advanced degree to be earned by December 1, 2018.
- Completion of an APTA-accredited residency program and/or ABPTS certification
