In addition to administrative and teaching responsibilities, this 12-month tenure-track position offers opportunities to collaborate or further develop a personal research agenda in the Human Performance Laboratory at the DiSepio Institute for Rural Health and Wellness. State—of-the-art equipment is available for use in both the laboratory and the on-campus interdisciplinary rehabilitation clinic to support individual and graduate student clinical and research experiences. The successful candidate will have an academic doctoral degree in physical therapy or a related field and be licensed or eligible for licensure as a physical therapist in Pennsylvania. Prior administrative and teaching experience in higher education is expected. Clinical or teaching expertise in neurologic rehabilitation, acute care, or amputation/wound management is desirable.

Saint Francis is seeking an individual interested in teaching primarily in the program's progressive neuromuscular curriculum. Pediatrics and acute care practice are also potential areas of teaching in this faculty role. The successful candidate will have experiential knowledge and clinical expertise primarily in Neuromuscular Differential Diagnosis and Rehabilitation. In addition, teaching and clinical experience in Acute Care, Amputee/Prosthetic Management, and/or Wound Care is also desired. A physical therapist with a doctoral degree (PhD, EdD, DSc) is required. An applicant with Clinical Specialist certification in neurology, pediatrics or geriatrics will be given priority review. The candidate must be eligible for licensure in Pennsylvania, with a 5-year minimum teaching, clinical and/or research experience.
