- 8. Participates in groups designed to involve community agencies in program planning and evaluation
- 9. Accepts leadership responsibilities within the Program
- 10. Participates in the recruitment of qualified faculty and students
- 11. Supervises the activities of adjunct lab instructors, if utilized
