Works collaboratively with the Director of Clinical Education (DCE) to administrate the clinical portion of the curriculum.

Engages in clinical site development, conducts student site visits, develops clinical faculty, creates and delivers remediation plans, enforces policy, carries out teaching duties within the clinical curriculum and performs other assigned duties.

Teaches didactic coursework within the Doctor of Physical Therapy program (see preferred attributes).

Advises and mentors students.

Contributes to university, school, departmental, and professional service.
