- An academic doctoral degree (e.g. PhD, EdD) in physical therapy or a related field from an accredited institution.
- Prior experience teaching or assisting in courses taught at the university level
- Prior experience in development, implementation, completion, and dissemination of research projects

Minimum qualifications for the rank of Associate Professor include each of the stated requirements for the rank of Assistant Professor and:

- Current rank of Associate Professor or Professor and a record of successful teaching experience in a university setting
 - A strong record of research productivity including demonstrated success in obtaining extramural grant funding
 - A record of sustained leadership and service to university and professional communities

Preferred qualifications for the rank of Assistant Professor include:

- Eligibility for physical therapy licensure in Arizona
- Post-doctoral research experience
- 2 years or more of teaching entry-level or post-professional physical therapy students
- An established research agenda with a record of peer-reviewed publications
- Demonstrated commitment to work with people from diverse backgrounds

Preferred qualifications for the rank of Associate Professor include:

- Experience that compliments existing faculty areas of expertise
- Research expertise as evidenced by sustained record of peer-reviewed publications and

external funding

- A sustained record of teaching excellence at the university level
 - A sustained record of university and professional service
 - Experience working with people from a variety of culturally diverse backgrounds
