The Department of Physical Therapy and Health at Bradley University invites qualified persons to apply for a tenure-track assistant professor position and the Director of Clinical Education (DCE) available August 2018.

This is a nine-month, full-time, tenure-track assistant professor position with additional interim and summer contracts primarily dedicated to the coordination of all aspects of clinical education (e.g. development, implementation, and evaluation) for the Bradley University's Doctorate of Physical Therapy Program. The DCE reports to the Program Director and is responsible for communication between Bradley University and affiliated clinical education sites. Applicants should have knowledge of legal, regulatory, and practice issues affecting clinical education. Applicants should have strong oral/written communication, organizational, problem-solving, and technological skills to ensure a quality learning experience for students and to foster ongoing development of the clinical education curriculum. Other responsibilities include teaching, service, and scholarship consistent with the mission and philosophy of the department and the university.

Candidates must be licensed or eligible for a physical therapy license in the State of Illinois and able to travel. Experience as a clinical instructor is required; however, experience as a credentialed clinical instructor, center coordinator of clinical education, and/or greater than two years' experience as a clinical instructor is preferred. Candidates must have earned a terminal doctorate (an entry-level or transitional DPT degree will not be considered a terminal doctoral degree). Candidates with an entry-level or transitional DPT will be considered, but are only eligible for tenure-track status upon completion of the terminal academic degree. Salary and title will be based on the experiences and qualifications of the applicant.

The Department of Physical Therapy and Health Science is comprised of a dynamic and collaborative faculty actively engaged in a student-centered learning environment. Thus, candidates who demonstrate initiative and an ability to work collaboratively with students, faculty, staff, clinicians, and others with diverse backgrounds are strongly encouraged to apply.
