Additional opportunities exist for contribution in the areas of prosthetics/orthotics, physiology, and neurology. The applicant should be an individual dedicated to teaching in an innovative, learner-centered DPT Program, which offers a hybrid curriculum that integrates traditional lecture with a modified case-based approach to graduate evidence-based Doctors of Physical Therapy. The faculty member should be willing to participate in both independent and team teaching. Teaching, research, and service (academic and professional) responsibilities are negotiable and dependent on the candidate's area of expertise, and the needs of the program. Academic responsibilities include DPT student advising; participation on relevant school, college and university committees; engagement in state and national professional service, and active engagement in scholarship. Release time is available for clinical practice in the community.

Marshall University is a state university with approximately 14,000 undergraduate and 4,000 graduate students. ### Description:

Students study gross anatomy in the cadaver lab at the Marshall University Robert Coon Medical Education Building. The program admits up to 40 DPT students each May.
