This is a full-time, 12-month faculty position tenure-track appointment beginning in August 2017. The successful candidate will be responsible for teaching in the entry-level Doctoral of Physical Therapy (DPT) program.

The DPT curriculum at Quinnipiac is a hybrid model of foundational science integrated into a professional model of health care delivery for contemporary society. Physical therapy knowledge and skills are applied through clinical decision-making with authentic cases in and out of the classroom.
