Topic: PTA Education Summit Update (Pamela Lavamgie)		

Discussion: Pam discussed the next steps- update and define the entry-level PTA. Delegates looking to create a motion to Charge the APTA members to develop a summit to look into defining entry-level PTA. There was a comparison of the summit and the pillars which found similarities. Findings are now published in the current edition of JoPTE.

Topic: Academy of Education Update (Pamela Lavangie) (1)

Discussion: Pam discussed the accomplishments of the PTAE SIG in the past several years. Applauded the development of the Webinar series and teaching and learning communities. Others are looking to adopt the models. Newsletter - encouraging involvement of PTA educators - Educational Leadership (Former ELI). Applications are now open APTAeducation.org (Fellowship tab available) Closed March 15, 2023. New Faculty Development workshop will be held in July. Registration is now open and will be held in Chicago. The professional development committee is developing an annual virtual development workshop. It will be available onsite and virtual. There is in the planning stages an initiative “Credentialed PT Educator” Create a list of competencies for PT/PTA educators, CE courses. A needs assessment will be sent in the next few weeks for professional development opportunities. Highly encourage all to participate. This link can be passed to all members/educators. Need to reach out to non-members. The competencies will include CAPTE 4G requirement.

Topic: CAPTE (Peggy Gleeson, Sharon Zergas)

Discussion: Sharon: PTA SSW is looking into changing the module of delivery to an asynchronous format to begin in April. Reminder of the NPTE Pass rate webinar is available on the APTA learning center (1 hour, 10min). What are the commissioners looking for in your report? Standards and required elements will have a second draft (available at capteonline.com). Listening sessions are available through March. New format for submitting notifications <http://forms.office.com/r/aAKVc2b>. (NEED CORRECTED) Peggy, discussed the revisions for the standards. A task force was developed to look into the standards. There is no longer a limitation on the length of time for the program. Standard 7 has been changed and is no longer itemized and left to more open reporting. Please review the 2nd draft which is available for review online. The third and final draft will be completed this summer. Goal to submit to the commissioners in September with it going into effect for 2024. There will be a 2 year grace period. You will have to decide on which version is best for you. There will be a new format in the onsite review process. There was a pilot completed with 6PTA and 6PT programs in which 2 reviewers were on site and 2 reviewers completed an initial paper review a d identify that all is covered and develop questions and let the staff know. The school will then be notified to make the changes prior to the final report/visit is complete. If you are interested in becoming a CAPTE reviewer, reach out to leadership to get involved.

Topic: FSBPT (Richard Woolf, David Relling)

Discussion: David was introduced as the new President for the next 3 years replacing Nancy Kirsch. Pass rates reviewed for the past 4 years. Graduation rates have slightly dropped over the 4 year period. NPTE Demo Exam was developed for free (24 questions PTA/ 24 questions PT) provides exposure to NPTE security agreement, tutorial for navigation, exam will not be scored. Review of the future testing dates. Received concerns regarding the holiday of July 4th however it will change in the next few years. Accommodations guidelines reviewed and how candidates apply (90 day window). Approval process is relatively quick. “Ensuring Validity FSBT” Google search. Just completed the practice analysis (move from 5 years to annual), a standard setting will be created for 2024. Exam questions decreased and added clinical scenarios. There is a shift from modalities. New content outline and design will be implemented Jan 2024. March 1, 2023 Webinar “The when, how, and why of the NPTE redesign” registration now open. 2024: 225

questions 180 scored/45 pretest, 40 scenario based questions. Standard review task force for PT/PTA accepting volunteers until March 9,2023.

Rich discussed the NPTE workshop for educators, next event October, sell out quickly. Continuing Education requirements have developed three main areas. Laws and the rules, self-assessment, Healthy practice self inventory. They have developed a survey regarding healthy practice for individuals and how it impacts patient care and encourage participation from all members.

PT Compact module for educators is being developed to provide to your students. Regulatory requirements for educators. FSBPT task for looking into part-time, hybrid licensing. Please refer to the website for more information.

Open discussion: Question from the floor, when will the changes move to the PEAT exams? There will be a transition in the summer.
