A twelve (12) month academic appointment is available at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor, with tenure or non-tenure track appointment, determined by the candidate's training and experience. The Physical Therapy Research Lab is a state-of-the-art facility including a 12-camera Qualisys Miquis Hybrid motion capture system capable of marker based and markerless tracking. This system is integrated with 4 embedded Bertec forceplates and an instrumented 3DI Treadmetrix treadmill to allow for robust collection and analysis of kinematic and kinetic data.

Qualified candidates will be a licensed physical therapist with a minimum of five (5) years of full-time practice, demonstrate contemporary expertise in their area of instruction, and exemplify the tenets of a Christian life in aiding CSU in becoming a Christian university nationally recognized for integrating faith in learning, leading and serving.
