The Department of Physical Therapy at Western Kentucky University invites applications for an 11 month, tenure track appointment at the rank of Assistant / Associate Professor. Responsibilities include teaching in the entry-level Doctor of Physical Therapy Program, research and other scholarly activities, and service to the department, college, university, and profession.

Requirements:

Successful candidates will meet the following criteria:

- Graduation from a CAPTE-accredited physical therapist program.
- Eligible for licensure by the Kentucky Board of Physical Therapy.
- Minimum of 3 years clinical experience as a physical therapist.
- A doctorate in physical therapy or an earned academic doctorate in a related field (PhD, EdD, DSc, etc.). Applicants who are ABD-status will also be considered.
