Minimum qualifications:

- Earned academic doctorate (PhD, EdD, DSc, etc.) or clinical doctorate
- 3 years of contemporary clinical experience as a Physical Therapist treating patients in with dysfunction directly related to teaching content
- Valid PT license in any state (PTLA will be considered if progress toward licensure indicates eligibility within one year while employed as a fulltime faculty member)

Preferred qualifications:

- University level teaching experience teaching content related to one or more of the following: neuroscience, exercise physiology, cardiovascular and pulmonary rehabilitation, critical care physical therapy, electrotherapeutic and thermal agents, pediatrics, integumentary physical therapy, and/or management of lymphedema
- Evidence of peer-reviewed dissemination of research
- American Board of Physical Therapy Specialties (ABPTS) certification (or other specialist credentials) reflecting expertise aligned with teaching needs
- Advanced academic training in physiology or related field
- Valid California PT license
